Term 1	Introduction to Careers Support	Students will be introduced to the Gatsby Benchmarks and will know how & where to get help with planning their future. They will understand the benefits of meeting with a qualified Careers Adviser & know how to book an appointment with a qualified Careers Adviser. 	Course Transfer Support (within the first 42 days of term)	All students who are either identified as at risk of withdrawal or who are considering transferring to a different course can meet with a Careers Adviser for one-to-one guidance.	
	Ongoing UCAS Support for L3Y2 & Access students Career Advantage	Group sessions to follow up from the introductory UCAS presentations during the first year of level 3 courses. These will include sessions on personal statement writing and completing the UCAS application form. Students will work independently towards the online LSEC Career Advantage Award which will help them develop valuable skills required by employers and universities. They will develop their social, entrepreneurial, digital and employability skills. Career Advantage gives students a better understanding of the labour market and how to access it. (Career Advantage is launched in tutorials by their student achievement tutors. Bespoke programmes are available for Study Programme Learners, HE, Access & Professional Courses & Apprentices)	
	One-to-one face to face and remote Information, advice and guidance meetings Introduction to Work Experience	Students and potential students can discuss their career ideas to provide appropriate support which can include raising aspirations, identifying and overcoming barriers. These meetings often include support with Career related topics such as CV, job search, skills development and labour market information. Students will learn about how work placements are organised at LSEC and what action they will need to take to prepare them for a successful work experience placement.	
	Career Fairs	Attending college careers fairs allows students to explore diverse career paths, network with potential employers, engage with university undergraduate students and access valuable resources from universities, training providers, and support services, enhancing their future opportunities.

Term 2	Introducing Progression Pathways	Students will learn about internal progression routes and understand the difference between employer and education pathways. 	National Apprenticeship Week	Students will participate in National Apprenticeship week activities and will find out about range of apprenticeships. Will learn about the positive impact that apprenticeships make to individuals, businesses and the wider economy.	
	National Careers Week	Students will participate in National Careers week activities including live-streamed employer events. Students will be able to research their next steps using current labour market information.	
	Internal Progression & Moving Up Meetings	Led by curriculum staff. Students who are not progressing at LSEC are referred to careers advisers at each campus and offered one-to-one meetings to discuss suitable options e.g. apprenticeships/alternative course	
	UCAS interview support	Mock interviews can be arranged with Careers Team. Guidance on interviews given via talks and recorded webinars from university outreach teams.

	Introduction to progressions options for L3Y1 students	Level 3, year 1 students will be introduced to all progression pathways including employment, apprenticeships, gap year and UCAS. 	Moving Up	Led by curriculum staff. Students not progressing are contacted by careers staff and offered one-to-one career guidance to look at alternative options/pathways.

Post Course Completion	Ongoing Support	Careers advice and guidance is available to support leavers with progression pathways.
